Where Do We Focus Our Work?

Have you ever heard of subsistence living? By definition, this term refers to individuals or families throughout the world who grow their own food to meet their daily needs. Most of their day is spent caring for their crops, fetching water, gathering firewood, and laboring on other basic survival tasks. According to the World Food Bank, at least 50% of the world's population today, 3.4 billion people, struggle to meet basic daily needs, earning less than \$5.50 US per day. Of these, nearly 1.9 billion people, or about 26% of the population, live on less than \$3.20 US per day. Even though these numbers are alarming, great strides have been made since the 1980's when the percentage of people living subsistence lives was 70%, but there is still a long way to go.

Subsistence living not only includes farmers living in rural areas, but also includes urban dwellers who depend on growing food and



Now, where do the majority of those living a subsistence lifestyle live? Have you heard of the 10/40 window? This is an area that refers to those regions of the eastern hemisphere, plus the European and African part of the western hemisphere, located between 10 and 40 degrees north of the equator, a general



area that was purported to have the highest level of socioeconomic challenges along with the least access to the Christian message and Christian resources on the planet.



Understanding this, the focus of **Hope Seeds** becomes clearer. We also include areas of the Caribbean, such as Haiti, the Dominican Republic, The Bahamas, and Cuba, along with Central American countries, such as Nicaragua, Guatemala, and Honduras, which face similar conditions.

Next, consider the daily average income for most of these areas compared with the average cost of a packet of seed. In many countries that cost can range from \$1.50 to \$3.50 US per packet (remember, the average person lives on \$3.20-\$5.50 US/day), and if seeds are available, depending on location, much of the time they are old and past their viability. So, it can cost up to a day's wages to buy a packet of seed that may or may not be good, but through Hope Seeds, recipients are receiving quality seed at no cost!

Finally, when we consider that most of those subject to **subsistence living** are also located in parts of the world with the least access to the message of Christ's love, where many are considered **unreached** or **unengaged** people groups, this narrows down our target area considerably. Our goal is to reach as many individuals and communities with the gospel message as possible, and we do this in a tangible way, not only with *The Message of Hope*, but also by sharing **life-saving seeds** and **sustainable garden techniques** that bring so much hope.

What's New this Year in Seeds?

Amaranth!!! has been added to our list of highly nutritional plants to help better improve health for those we serve. Both the content of nutrients in amaranth grains and leaves are very nutritious. The leaves are exceptionally

high in vitamin C, iron, carotene, calcium, folic acid, and protein. There have been reports from UNDP that the incidence of childhood blindness has been greatly reduced when amaranth is included in the daily diet of children. Not only does amaranth have great health benefits, it's also very drought resistant which makes this plant ideal for many warm/dry areas where we send seed. Amaranth is truly a miracle plant!



Life-Saving Seeds on their way to South Sudan!

Hope Seeds is now partnering with ACROSS, a ministry in the Republic of South Sudan. Understanding Hope



Seeds' strategic areas of concern, South Sudan is an important area for Hope Seeds to focus our ministry. According to the World Food Bank, the Republic of South Sudan became the world's newest nation and Africa's 55th country on July 9, 2011. Renewed conflicts in December 2013 and again in 2016 have undermined the development gains achieved since South Sudan became independent and have worsened the humanitarian situation.



The formation of a national unity government in February 2020 provided for a positive outlook. Nonetheless, subsequent shocks that included flooding in parts of the country, locust infestation, and COVID-19 have changed the outlook. South Sudan remains in a serious humanitarian crisis due to the cumulative effects of years of conflict which have destroyed people's livelihoods. Extreme levels of acute food insecurity persist across the country leaving nearly 7.5 million (more than half of the population) in need of humanitarian assistance and protection in 2020. Almost 4 million people remain displaced by the humanitarian crisis, with nearly 1.6 million people displaced internally and some 2.26 million from South Sudan living as refugees in six neighboring countries. Women and children continue to be the most affected.

However, despite the hardships, missionaries like Carol Ward with Favor International and the Janzens with ACROSS have stayed the course through very difficult and dangerous times to bring the hope of Jesus to so many. As of the first of March, enough seeds, training materials, and The Message of Hope for the first 500 families were on the way to South Sudan to help share the good news of Jesus and equip many to feed their families. Let's pray for the effort of all who serve on the front lines and for Hope Seeds that we can work diligently to provide the necessary support for those we serve.
